Increasing your points

IN THE CLOUD

Points are awarded in two categories:

Full-time paid professional experience. If the experience is deemed relevant, one point is awarded per year of employment, up to a maximum of 5 points.

Part-time paid professional experience. If the experience is deemed relevant, one point is awarded per year of employment, up to a maximum of 2 points.

Students may make a claim for points in either or both of these categories, and may be awarded up to a maximum of 7 points in total.

Please note that:

- 1. Points cannot be awarded where the information provided is ambiguous or incomplete.
- Points awarded for professional experience are entirely at the discretion of the PAC PME team, representing the participating universities.
- 3. Points are not awarded for teaching in a second-level school while unqualified.

Full time employment is taken to mean full time hours. Continuous employment for at least 9 months is required to claim points for one year.

Part time can be considered if either (i) part time throughout the year, or (ii) full time for a period of three months (e.g. summer employment).

A Letter from employer certifying the dates, nature of employment, and salary OR

A completed employer reference form (download here) must be supplied to verify work experience being claimed for points purposes.

Increasing your points

The points system for academic performance set out below is designed to take account of all eligible level 8 primary degrees - including two-subject honours degrees, single honours degrees and degrees with one subject at honours level and one subject at pass level. In the case of eligible General Level 8 Degrees of the NUI (i.e. three subject pass degrees), points will be allocated using the schedule for pass papers. **The following should assist applicants who wish to calculate their points**

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

1. How long is the programme?

The programme is two years in duration.

2. Is the programme part-time?

No. The PME (Post-Primary Teaching) is a two-year, full time, evening delivery programme. Lectures are held on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings from 4-8pm. Additionally some modules and tutorials are delivered online. Furthermore you are required to spend a minimum of 8 hours per week in a second level school completing teaching and placement related activities

3. Is my degree recognised for registration as a teacher in post-primary schools?

You need to consult the <u>Teaching Council's Requirements for Teacher Registration</u> to see if your undergraduate qualifications meet the requirements set out by the Teaching Council of Ireland, the professional standards body for teaching in Ireland. As part of the application process you will need to confirm that your degree complies with these requirements. We do not review your qualifications to ascertain if they meet the <u>Teaching Council's criteria</u>.

4. How many credits do I need in my undergraduate subject(s) to become a teacher?

Teaching Council sets the criteria for registration as a teacher of a specific subject(s). You must meet the requirements for at least one curricular subject in order to be considered for registration as a teacher, upon completion of the Professional Master of Education (PME). As part of the PME application process you will be asked to complete a <u>Subject Declaration Form</u> for the subject(s) you wish to be registered to teach. This allows you to match the credits in your degree subject(s) against the Teaching Council's requirements for that curricular subject.

If you are offered a place on the PME, your declaration form, along with transcripts of your undergraduate examination results, will be forwarded to the Teaching Council. The Teaching Council will then confirm if you will be eligible to register as a teacher and which curricular subject(s) will be recorded on the Register of Teachers following successful completion of the PME.

If you are unsure if your undergraduate degree meets these requirements please check with the institution where you completed your undergraduate degree. If you have any queries in relation to the module names, codes and credits etc, please contact the department(s) where you did your undergraduate degree. We do not have access to this information and we do not review your qualifications to ascertain if they meet the Teaching Council requirements.

5. What do I do if my degree is not currently recognised by the Teaching Council?

You need to identify and confirm where your shortfall exists. You will need to engage in further studies to address these shortfalls. It is up to you to identify the modules you need to complete and to apply to the relevant provider. We do not provide advice on what modules you should complete in order to meet the <u>Teaching Council's Post-Primary Curricular Subject Requirements</u>. If you decide to proceed with the Professional Masters of Education without confirming that your gualifications will be recognised for registration with Council. DCU will not accept liability.

Make an Application

To make an application please go to PAC and select the DCU PME Course Code DC905. Please note that as part of the application process you will be required to complete Subject Self-Declaration Form(s) for the curricular subject(s) you intend to teach on completion of the PME. These form(s) must be completed in full during the application process, as it is not possible to update form(s) once the application is submitted.

Required Documentation

Please note applications close on Friday 12th February 2021. Documents outlined below must be uploaded to PAC by 26th February 2021. PAC will not accept any documents sent by email or by post.

1. Certified Copies of Transcripts

Certified copies of original transcripts of results for each year of study at undergraduate/postgraduate must be uploaded to PAC. Please note portal/web page printouts are NOT acceptable.

2. DCU Subject Specialisms Form

3. School Placement Form

Applicants should secure a school placement prior to application. In exceptional circumstances where an applicant has not secured a placement by the time of application, the School Placement Form must be submitted by 4th June 2021. If an applicant has not secured a placement by 4th June 2021 their offer will be withdrawn. Only students with a secured placement can register with DCU for the programme.

4. Employer Reference

Only required if claiming work experience for points purposes (must be signed by employer).

5. Copy of a valid passport

The course aims to prepare new entrants for the teaching profession who are subject experts in their chosen discipline, are knowledgeable, creative and reflective about the aims and processes of education and who are professional in all aspects of their work.

Admission Requirements

Applicants must be university graduates, normally with an honors Bachelor degree that includes, as a substantial component, at least one subject from the list of those taught at Leaving Certificate level in Ireland. Applicants are short listed for interview on the basis of our Application Scoring System (PDF) including what qualifies as relevant professional or voluntary experience. Applicants must provide two academic references or one academic reference and one professional reference from relevant professional experience. All academic references must be from a third-level institution. Interviews are held in February / March and offers are made to successful applicants directly following this.

Applicants should be aware of specific entry criteria to the teaching profession which are set and regulated by the DES in association with the Teaching Council of Ireland, and which must be satisfied independently of the School of Education's entry requirements. Therefore, as part of the application process, applicants are required to complete a self-declaration form regarding their eligibility to teach specific curricular subjects.

Course Description

The Professional Masters in Education (PME) is a required qualification for those wishing to work as post-primary school teachers in the Republic of Ireland and a recognised teaching qualification within the EU. The course aims to prepare new entrants for the teaching profession who are subject experts in their chosen discipline, are knowledgeable, creative and reflective about the aims and processes of education and who are professional in all aspects of their work. The 2 year full-time PME programme provides a holistic programme for the preparation of individuals for a career in the teaching profession through the development of critical and analytical skills, creative methods and strategies for teaching and a reflective professional approach to teaching and learning. Students undertake specialised pedagogical studies related to post-primary curriculum subjects from the following set (applicants select one at application as their major subject, where available):

- Business Studies (including Accounting and Economics);
- English;
- Geography;
- History;
- An Ghaeilge;
- Mathematics (including Applied Mathematics);
- Modern Languages (including French, German, Italian, Spanish and other Curricular Languages);
- Music;
- Religious Education;
- Science (including Biology, Chemistry and Physics).

In addition to this, the programme components include:

- · Foundation disciplines of education: assessment, inclusive education, history and policy of Irish education, philosophy, sociology, psychology and history of education.
- · School Placement modules in each year of the programme undertaken in a post-primary school within a radius of 35 km (one way, 70 km return) from Dublin city centre.
- Research Dissertation completed in Year 2.



Accounting

In order to meet the registration requirements set down in the Teaching Council [Registration] Regulations in respect of the curricular subject of Accounting an applicant must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- (a) Applicants must hold a degree-level qualification, with Accounting studied up to and including third-year level or higher (or modular equivalent).
 - (b) The qualifying degree must be equivalent to at least Level 8 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ) and with a minimum pass result in all examinations pertinent to the subject of Accounting.
 - (c) The qualifying degree must carry at least 180 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) credits (or equivalent) with the specific study of Accounting comprising at least 60 ECTS credits (or equivalent).
- The study of Accounting during the qualification must show that the holder has acquired sufficient knowledge, skills and understanding to teach the Accounting syllabus/specification to the highest level in post- primary education (see www.curriculumonline.ie).

To meet this requirement the qualification must include the study of all the following Essential Areas:

- a) Financial Accounting
- b) Management Accounting

The remaining ECTS credits may be drawn from the following areas or their equivalents:

- c) Company/ Business Law
- d) The Conceptual and Regulatory Framework of Accounting
- e) Information and Communication Technology in Accounting
- f) Other accounting areas of study, for example, forensic accounting

Politics & Society

In order to meet the registration requirements set down in the Teaching Council (Registration) Regulations in respect of the curricular subject of Politics and Society, an applicant must meet <u>all</u> of the following criteria:

- (a) Applicants must hold a degree-level qualification, with Politics/Political Science or Sociology, or a combination of at least three of the following areas: Politics/Political Science, Sociology, Anthropology, Law, European Studies, Public Administration, Government, Development, Media Studies, Economics, History, Geography, International Relations or Philosophy comprising a minimum total of 60 ECTS credits or equivalent.
- (b) The qualifying degree must be equivalent to at least Level 8 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ) and must carry at least 180 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) credits (or equivalent).
- (c) Applicants must also have completed a post-primary initial teacher education (age range12-18 years) carrying a minimum of 120 ECTS credits (or equivalent).
