What to do after your degree?

- Start before you finish your degree
- Startnow

- Look at your interests (Interest Tests) and skills
- Find out more about the job titles that interestyou
 (even if you only have a very vague idea at the moment)
- It is ok not toknow
- It can take time to explore options and find what works for you...ongoing process



What can I do after my degree?

- Do you want to do further study?
- Do you need to do further study for a particular career?
- Do you want a job after you finish your degree?
- Do you want to take some time out?



Step 2 – Opportunities... What is out there?

Find out more about careers by:

- Researching career areas and job descriptions
- Find out
 - Can you apply to start these jobs after yourdegree?
 - Do you need a postgraduatequalification?
 - Do you need relevant experience?
- Information Interviewing
- Work experience/shadowing/volunteering



Some options

- <u>Further study</u> in the same area(s) of study as your undergraduate degree
- <u>Further study</u> in a different area(s) of study as your undergraduatedegree
- <u>Employment</u> directly related to the subject you studied
- <u>Employment</u> not directly related to the subject you studied
- Other CV building exercises, work experience, voluntary work, internship, travel, year out to look at career options in more detail...



Why do further study?

- I have an interest (or talent) in my subject and I wishto continue exploring / learning / researching
- I have identified a career area that I wish to enter, and I need further qualifications to gain entry



Conversion courses...

- You can gain entry to a taught postgraduate coursesin
 almost any subject from your current position
- Conversion courses take the relevant subject material from an undergraduate course and teach it intensively in a postgraduate course
- Accountancy, many Arts subjects, Business, Computer Science/IT, Media, Psychology, some Social Science programmes...

Postgraduate Study

Postgraduate study or Graduate study refers to any course of study which can be undertaken after completion of an undergraduate (Level 8) degree. In the sections below you can find information on types of postgraduate courses, how to research course content, entry requirements and closing dates and where to look for courses. Apply for postgraduate study can require a significant amount of work which may involve investigating funding options, filling in an application form and writing a personal statement. You may also wish to look at opportunities to study abroad.

How to apply...

- Some popular/competitive programmes close early (e.g. December)
- Some stay open until July
- Applications are either at <u>www.pac.ie</u> or on the website of the particular university. Applications usually require university transcripts (results), personal statement & 2 references(or referee names) and possibly a CV.
- Usually one application form per institution. €50 approx. each form
- Contact the course coordinators for more details regarding course content
- Apply to SUSI if applicable and check if the university ahs additional funding for which you can apply e.g. Taught Masters Bursaries / Scholarships (Contact Graduate Studies Office)



Jobs

- Employers contact the Careers Service on an on-going basis throughout the year
- Jobs advertised on Careers Connect
- Most recruitment takes place during finalyear
- Think about an internship valuable experience
- CV and Applications

 - CV Review: Send a query or book an appointment on Careers Connect



What an employer values...

- Your skill set, which you develop through competing your course work and attending university
- Any subject knowledge or subject specific skillsetsyour developed
- Your academic performance (your grades)
- Any other activities your have done e.g. clubs/socs, sports, part-time work, volunteering, work experience



Jobs

- 30%-40% jobs: Any discipline
- How is this possible?

- Company will train you in what you need to know.




Each year Maynooth University Careers Service works closely with many employers seeking to recruit Maynooth University students and graduates.
