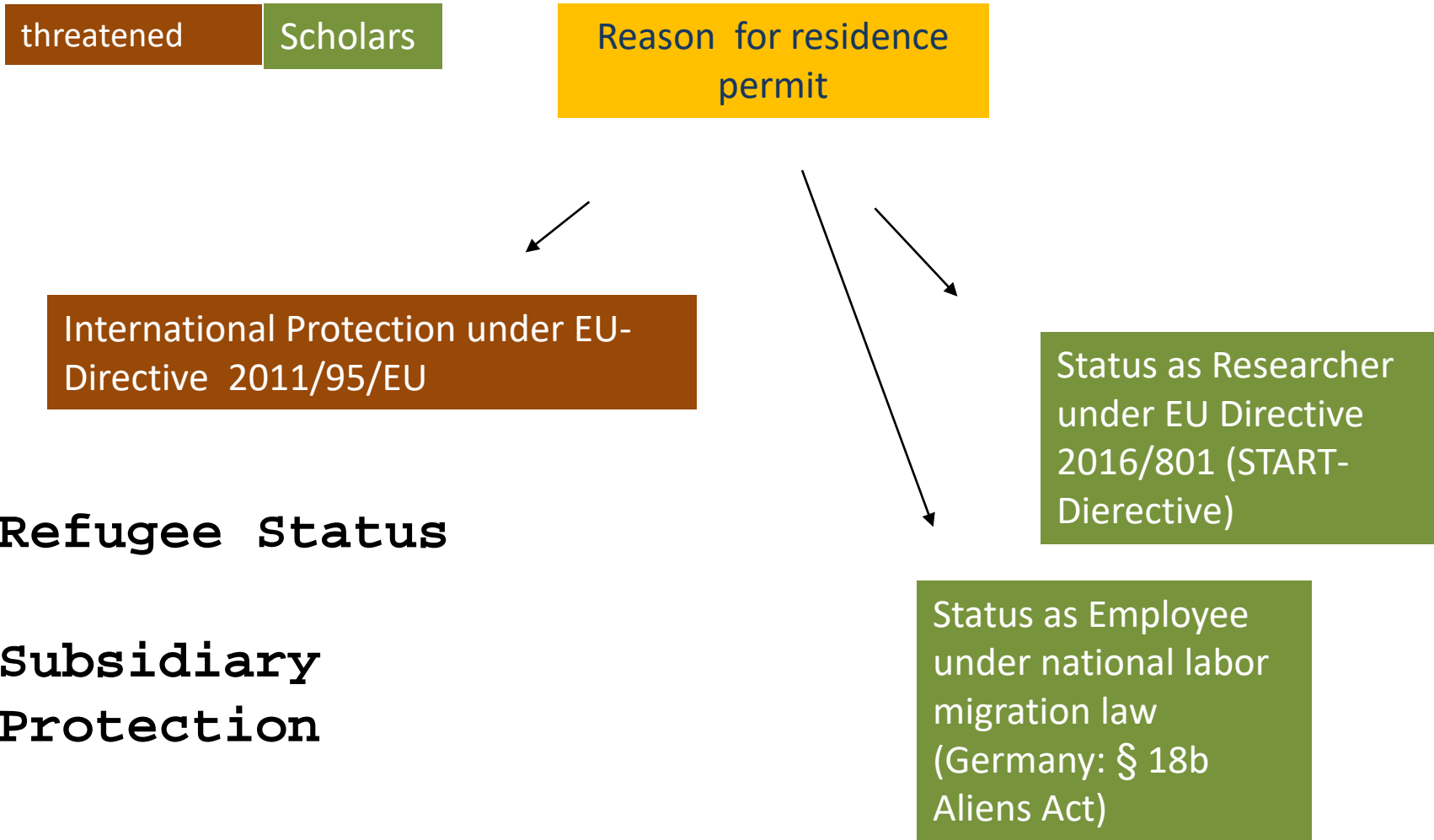

International Protection under EU-Directive 2011/95/EU

Issues to discuss:

- Access to Europe (no visa regime provided for)
- State responsible determined by Dublin Regulation
- Recognition by Federal Office
- Failed recognition: danger of deportation
- No access to START-Directive

Status as Researcher under EU
Directive 2016/801 (START-Directive)

Access to Europe

- **Visa for access**
- **Hosting agreement**

Status as Researcher under EU
Directive 2016/801 (START-Directive)

Mobility within
Europe

- No visa within Schengen Area required
- Permission may applied for straightly in the other EU / Schengen State

threatened

Scholars

Status as Employee under national labor migration law (Germany: § 18b Aliens Act)

Mobility within Europe

- No visa within Schengen Area required
- Permission may not generally applied for straightly in the other EU / Schengen State
