The Master of Education (Research in Practice) explores Action Research in its many forms within educational settings. Participants will develop a deep theoretical understanding and critical awareness of practitioner research. The programme is underpinned by the philosophy of Froebel, his contemporaries and later scholars.



Who is the programme for?

The programme is aimed primarily at candidates who are working in the Early Childhood Education sector.

Entry requirements

As the Action Research study is based on practice, candidates are required to be in regular employment in educational settings.

Applicants must hold a level 8 degree in Early Childhood Education with a minimum grade level of 2:1.

In 2020-21, applicants must complete Modules ED671, ED672 and ED673 prior to commencing Modules EDF680-EDF684 in year 2 (2021-22).
