Once you have been nominated by your home university you will be contacted with information on how to apply to Maynooth University.

## Application deadlines for 2020/21:

Full Year June 30th
1st Semester June 30th
2nd Semester October 30th

**Acceptance Letters** will be emailed to students a few weeks after the application deadline.

# LANGUAGE:

- No language proficiency certificate is required.
- However, we expect students to have a very good command of English in all four language skills - writing, reading, listening and speaking.
- International coordinators may refuse to approve a required course if the English comptency of a student is insufficient to complete the course.

# TRAVEL / MEDICAL INSURANCE:

- All Erasmus students must have travel insurance including repatriation covering the period of stay
- When applying you will be asked to upload a copy of your insurance.
   Failure to do so will result in not being able to register
- The European Health Insurance Card will not suffice in this case

## PICKING COURSES:

- Visit the <u>available courses</u> page to see your **module options**
- Modules must be approved by home university
- Students often have to make changes to their original course choice and learning agreement due to timetable clashes, limited spaces, course no longer being available, etc
- Modules will be chosen using IMAS prior to arrival
- Students must upload a certified transcript of all results to date in order to be approved for their modules.
- The certificate must be a certified translation or it will not be accepted by the system.

## GETTING HERE:

# ORIENTATION:

- Orientation sessions are compulsory to attend
- Students will meet international coordinators who will sign module form needed to register courses

## REGISTRATION:

#### Full Year, 1st. & 2nd Semester

## **Term dates**

#### 1st Semester:

21st Sept. 2020 - 23rd Jan. 2021

## 2nd Semester:

1st Feb. 2021 - 5th June 2021

- 1st semester students cannot extend their stay to full year after they have registered
- 1st semester students will not write exams, alternative arrangements will be made, & your stay will end on 18th December
- Students are allowed to register for max 35 credits per semester and they will have one week after the registration date to change their mind and register new modules.
