Maynooth University Modular Master of Education Programme

The Master of Education (Modular M.Ed.)

This taught Master of Education programme is designed for those interested in the field of educational studies. Its flexible modular design offers the opportunity of completing a Master of Education Degree full-time, in one year, or part-time, over two or more years. It is a 90-credit degree with each module counting for 10 credits. In their final year students choose to complete either a Thesis (thirty credits) or a Capstone Project (20 credits).

Modules are taught on weekday evenings. Some are offered as Easter and Summer choices. Students can choose from across the range of modules on offer to develop a general track or their own personalised track. The modules are organised under general themes, some align with two or more themes:

- 1. Educational Leadership (EL)
- 2. Teacher Education (TE)
- 3. Social Justice Education (SJE)
- 4. Early Childhood Teaching and Learning (ECTL)
- 5. Wellbeing (W)
- 6. Pedagogy (P)

Please note where there is insufficient student registration for a module offered then it will be withdrawn and students encouraged to choose another in its place.

Graduates of the Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Leadership and some other postgraduate courses are eligible for module exemptions.

It is possible to study modules of particular interest without completing a Master of Education degree or to exit with a Postgraduate Diploma in Educational Studies after completing 60 credits.

Modules

Modules from across the themes are offered each year but not all modules are offered each year. Please refer to the current timetable. The range of modules made available each year is dependent on student uptake. If too few students register for a scheduled module then it will be withdrawn from the choice available and students will be encouraged to choose another in its place.

NOTE: Students who are undertaking ED 607 Thesis or ED 674 Capstone Project must also complete ED 618 in the same year.

Full-Time Option

Master of Education Full-Time – 90 credits (PAC Code: MH52G, Course Code EDEDF6)

The M.Ed. full-time is completed in one academic year. Full-time students will select:

All 3 compulsory modules (ED 617, ED 604, ED 618).

<u>Either</u> capstone (ED 674, worth 20 credits) <u>OR</u> Thesis (ED 607, worth 30 credits).

1. If Thesis, then select 3 additional modules of your choice;

2. If capstone, then select 4 additional modules of your choice (to bring to 90 credits in total).

Comprising:

3 x Compulsory Modules (30 credits) 3 x Chosen Modules (30 credits) ED 607 Thesis (30 credits) OR

3 x Compulsory Modules (30 credits) 4 x Chosen Modules (40 credits) ED 674 Capstone Project (20 credits)



Part-Time Option

Master of Education Part-Time - 90 credits (PAC Code: MH57G, Course Code EDEDM6)

The M.Ed. part-time can be completed over 2- 8 years. Part-time students will select:

All 3 compulsory modules (ED 617, ED 604, ED 618*).

*ED 618 must be completed in the same year as the Thesis (ED 607) or Capstone Project (ED 674). Part-time students may NOT complete Thesis or Capstone Project or ED 618 in their first year of study.

<u>Either</u> capstone (ED 674, worth 20 credits) <u>OR</u> Thesis (ED 607, worth 30 credits).

- 1. If Thesis, then select 3 additional modules of your choice;
- 2. If capstone, then select 4 additional modules of your choice (to bring to 90 credits in total).

Comprising:

3 x Compulsory Modules (30 Credits) 3 x Chosen Modules (30 credits) ED 607 Thesis (30 credits) OR 3 x Compulsory Modules (30 Credits) 4 x Chosen Modules (40 credits) ED 674 Capstone Project (20 credits)
