(6) IDA has strengthened its collective response capacity to coordinate the views and represent the diversity of the global disability rights movement

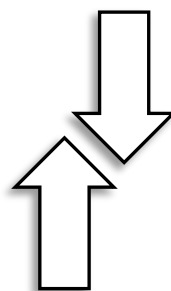
TECHNICAL CAPACITIES

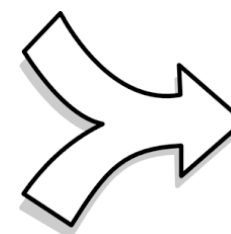
UNDERREPRESENTED GROUPS

The rights of persons with disabilities are advanced by Member States, the UN and international cooperation stakeholders across human rights, development, peace and security agendas, **in partnership with and through meaningful engagement of Organisations of Persons with Disabilities** technically equipped to frame, deliver and monitor policies and programmes that affect their lives.

HUMAN RIGHTS STANDARDS

(1) The UN human rights system, its mechanisms and jurisprudence uphold the highest CRPD standards to advance all human rights for all persons with disabilities

INTERNATIONAL DEVELOPMENT & HUMANITARIAN FRAMEWORKS

(2) Sustainable development and humanitarian frameworks include references, and their implementation increasingly responds to the human rights and priorities of persons with disabilities

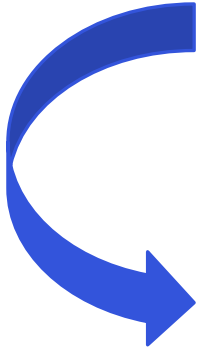
INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION STAKEHOLDERS

(3) International cooperation stakeholders have increased their political will, technical capacity and resourcing towards CRPD-compliant disability-inclusive development and humanitarian action
