M.Sc./Doctorate in Psychological Science (Behaviour Analysis and Therapy)

First Doctoral level training in Behavior Analysis in Ireland and the UK, conferring eligibility for the Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) qualification

Features of the course

- Students can complete two years of the course and graduate with a Masters, or complete a third year of supervised research to graduate with a Doctorate
- The BCBA approval applies to the first two years, thus students need not complete the doctoral year for BCBA eligibility
- The course is full-time* and involves attending weekly classes for the first two academic years (e.g. every Monday throughout each semester between 10am and 6pm, with occasional attendance required during weekends)
- Students will complete casework relating directly to their on-going role in a relevant facility
- There are no formal classes in third year, but students will attend regular meetings with their research supervisor, submit a doctoral thesis, and attend a viva voce

- Ethical & Professional Conduct I
- Concepts, Principles, Foundations: Behaviour Analysis
- Functional Behavioural Assessment
- Measurement, Experimental Design & Data Analysis I
- Behaviour Change Procedures
- Clinical Behaviour Analysis: Principles & Practices
- Systems, Organisations, Management & Supervision I
- Research I (Project & Thesis)

What does the course offer?

- The first doctoral level training in Behaviour Analysis in Ireland and the UK
- Eligibility to sit the examination for the higher level Board Certified Behavior Analyst (BCBA) qualification
- Access to state-of-the-art research and computing facilities
- Opportunity to study under academic staff with international reputations in behaviour analysis (e.g. in 2012, Professor Dermot Barnes-Holmes was the first ever non-American psychologist to be given the ABA International Don Hake Translational Research Award from the American Psychological Association)

- Experimental Design & Data Analysis
- Clinical Behaviour Analysis: Applications
- Measurement, Design & Data Analysis II
- Ethics and Professional Conduct II
- Systems, Organisations, Management
- Research II (Project & Thesis)

- Candidates will ideally hold a primary degree in Psychology and be employed in a setting that would facilitate the appropriate casework.
- We may be able to assist students who fail to acquire employment in securing relevant voluntary experience in an appropriate setting

- Duration: 3 years full-time* for Doctorate, 2 years full-time* for M.Sc. Degree
- Course Commences: September 2014 (Date to be confirmed; commencement is subject to sufficient numbers of successful applicants)
