As such, [Institution] calls attention to the release of *Free to Think*, a new report indicating that scholars, students and other members of higher education communities around the world regularly suffer violent and coercive attacks. The report, which is being released at the United Nations Palais des Nations in Geneva, on Tuesday, 23 June from 12:00-14:00, represents over four years of research by SAR's Academic Freedom Monitoring Project. The report analyzes 333 attacks on higher education arising from 247 verified incidents in 65 countries between January 2011 and May 2015 and demonstrates the pressing need to raise awareness and document attacks on higher education.
