#### What to look for when viewing accommodation?

occurry, burely	
Test that the windows and doors lock securely.	
Street lighting/ visibility	
Trust your instinct.	
Does the house have an alarm?	
Facilities	
Turn on the shower.	
Check that the cooker works. All hob/rings, oven and grill.	
Note the number of electric sockets in the room.	
Location, location	
Access to public transport	
Vicinity to amenities	
Does the area look & feel safe.	
Think outside the box: Celbridge, Kilcock, Leixlip, Lucan	
Interior	
Can you smell damp or mould? Are there any obvious dark patches on the walls?	
Is the house warm, <u>clean</u> and dry?	
Is there adequate ventilation?

### House Rules

Can I smoke? Where?	
Is there a specific time that the landlord would like to use the kitchen and should I cook my dinner at another time? (if self-catering)	
Is the food in the kitchen available to me?	
Will my room be used by family during Christmas and Easter breaks (if I'm away and not paying for those weeks)?	
How many other people live in the house? Who will I be sharing the bathroom with?	
Can I have a place to store my food/room in the fridge?	
When will I get my deposit back? How will it be paid? Will it be used as the last month's rent?	

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# Key Questions to Ask

How much is the deposit?	
Are meals provided and if not can I use the kitchen to prepare my own meals?	
Length of notice to leave and any other charges, i.e. utilities	
Do I pay over study weeks, exam weeks or Easter time?	
Can I have a friend/relative to stay overnight – what are the rules and is there a charge?

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## Your checklist


Receipts for deposit and all rent paid rent books advisable	
Who has a key to your bedroom door? What access does the landlord have to your room/the property?	
Take <b>photos</b> of the room(s) and an <b>inventory</b> [a list of everything provided by the landlord and their condition]	
Ask for full <b>contact details</b> of your landlord. In return you should provide your full contact details including your student number, home address and next of kin.	
Be clear, in written form, of the duration of the tenancy and if you will pay for absences.
