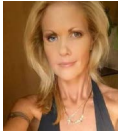
DR GRAHAM LOVE, CEO, HRB

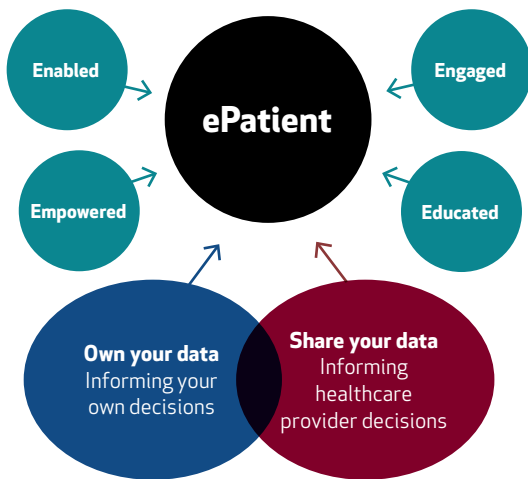
