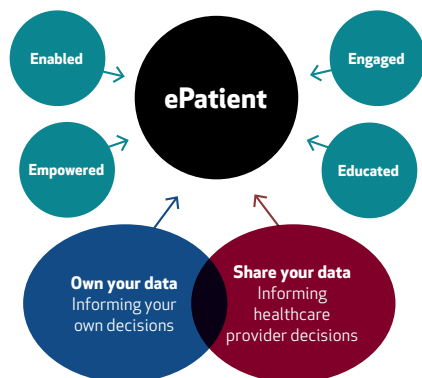
GREG PRICE, QUALITY IMPROVEMENT DIVISION, HSE
