
Law & Society in Ireland is a free online course exploring how law affects our everyday lives and how it can be used to promote equality and human rights.

Topics

Introduction to Law in Ireland



- Law, Equality and Human Rights (including a case study on Disability Law)
- Law & Society (looking at Law & Work and Law & Property)
- Crime and Punishment

Lecturers from Maynooth University's Department of Law will teach the course. Guest speakers (including solicitors and barristers) will give insights into how the law works in practice



There is a maximum of 50 places on this course.

We will prioritise applications from people who may otherwise find it difficult to access university-style learning opportunities (in particular, applicants for international protection; people without a documented immigration status; people with caring responsibilities; and older people who have not completed a university qualification).
