TRANSPORT



FROM THE AIRPORT TO CITY CENTER

Kraków John Paul II International Airport is located approximately 10 km from the city center.

BUS**

Krakow Airport is served by three regular bus lines: 208 and 252 and 308 and one night line:

The tickets can be purchased on the bus.



**BY
TRAIN**

The most convenient way to get to the city center is by train, which is located near the passenger terminal.

It costs approximately 2 euro and you get to the main station in Kraków (in Polish 'Kraków Główny') in 20 minutes. The tickets can be purchased in a ticket machine on a platform (cash payment or payment with credit/debit card) or directly from a train conductor on board (cash payment in Polish zloty only).

Unfortunately, due to the modernization of the railway system, the railway timetable will be limited on the route to and from Kraków Airport. Additional bus communication is introduced between train courses. It's better to check the timetable before your travel [here](#).



**BY
TAXI**

You can find many taxis in front of the airport, but they may be overpriced.

You can also use 'UBER' or 'BOLT' applications (10-15 euros).

FROM THE TRAIN STATION

BY FOOT



You can get from the train station to your hotel in 20 minutes. You will be walking through the historical part of the city.

BY TRAM



You can take a train nr 3 at the main train station East (in Polish Dworzec Główny Zachód), you will need to pass through a shopping mall in order to get to the tram stop. The tickets are available in the machine on the tram stop and inside the tram. You can get a regular 20 minutes ticket. Get off after 2 stops at the main post office (in Polish Poczta Główna). You still need to walk few minutes to the hotel.

BY TAXI



You can find many taxis in front of the train station.

You can also use 'UBER' or 'BOLT' applications.

HOTELS

HOTEL WAWEL

Hotel Wawel is located on Poselska 22 in Kraków's Old Town, between Wawel Castle and the Main Market Square. It features modernly appointed rooms with free Wi-Fi. The Wawel occupies a 16th-century building that has been redesigned in Art Nouveau style.

COLLEGIUM MAIUS

The Collegium Maius (Latin for "Great College") located in Kraków Old Town is the Jagiellonian University's oldest building, dating back to the 14th century. It stands at the corner of Jagiellońska (Jagiellon Street) and Świętej Anny (St. Anne Street) near the Main Square of the historic city centre. Collegium Maius is the location of the Jagiellonian University Museum. The standing exhibition consists of historic interiors and the collection of scientific instruments.

The welcoming dinner on 8 January will take place at Corleone on Poselska 19, an Italian restaurant in the heart of Kraków. We will meet there at 7pm.

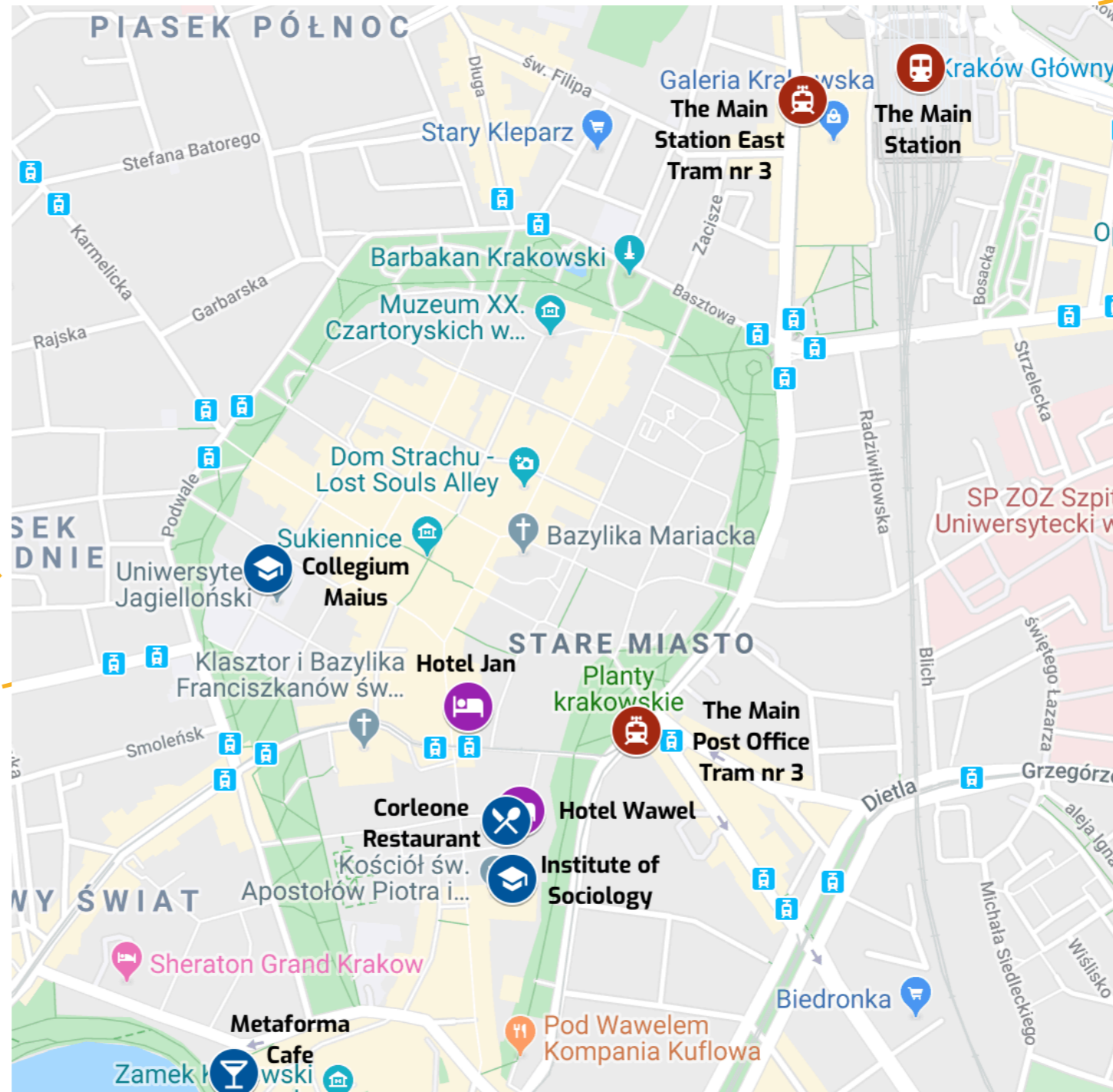
METAFORMA CAFE
