Maynooth University welcomed over 2,000 new postgraduate students in autumn 2018. Supporting Research Supervision 2019

Symposium on Doctoral Education A symposium on the 'Maynooth Doctorate in the 21st Century' will be held on Friday 12 April, 09.30-14.00. Doctoral Supervisor of the Year 2018, Dr Denise Rooney (Dept of Chemistry), will give the keynote lecture: 'Trainee vs. The Independent Scholar: Bridging the Paradox of Doctoral Supervision.' Speaking on the impact of research supervision, Dr. Rooney said 'The research supervisor has a huge role to play in supporting the student through their PhD studies. It is the role of the supervisor to train the student in research skills, while at the same time promoting their independent development as a scholar. The supervisor is a mentor, a teacher, a motivator, and a project manager. Welltrained, motivated graduate students are more likely to successfully complete their studies and act as positive role models for their peers and undergraduate students.'

The symposium will address issues such as doctoral education in a changing world, cohort supervision, and 'Finishing well'. Venue and registration details to follow.
