Entry Requirements:

Minimum 2.1 degree (NFQ Level 8) or equivalent in any discipline – obtained by July in year of entry.

Candidates must also sit GAMSAT test – will be used to select students for the programmes.

Admission:

Places on courses are allocated solely based on GAMSAT Examination results. Prospective candidates are not interviewed.

You will be required to bring acceptable photo ID to test centre (i) valid passport or (ii) current driver's licence or (iii) a current EU/EEA National Identity Card or (iv) Irish Public Services Card. Registration NOT accepted after deadline.

Disability: You may apply for reasonable adjustments to testing conditions on grounds of disability.

Closing dates:

30th January 2023 for March sitting. Late registration up to 10am on 9th February 2023 (€75 late registration fee)

11th July 2023 for September sitting. Late registration up to 1pm on 29th July 2023 (€75 late registration fee)

Test Dates: 18th – 22nd March 2023 / 8th – 12th September 2023

Fee: €344. Registration fees- refunded on request to GAMSAT Ireland Office up the late registration date (€75 administration fee).

Deferrals must be completed no later than 10am 10th February 2023 (€40 administration fee)

Results: You will receive a score for each of the 3 sections and an overall score. The overall score is a weighted average of the 3 sections. You will receive an email explaining how to access your results online. You will need the email address you registered with and your GAMSAT candidate ID.

GAMSAT scores are valid for 2 years. Appeals or requests for re-marking not considered.

Re-sit: No limit on number of times you can sit test.
