ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

This programme is primarily aimed at candidates who are working in the Post Primary, Primary and Early Childhood Education sectors and who wish to develop their practice through Action Research. Candidates are required to be in regular employment in an educational setting and to meet one of the criteria listed below:

- 1. A four year level 8 Bachelor of Education degree or equivalent with a minimum grade level of 2.1, be fully probated, and registered with the Teaching Council.
- 2. A level 9 Postgraduate Diploma in Inclusive and Special Education (PDISE) or Higher Diploma in Primary Education, be fully probated and registered with the Teaching Council.
