MU – first on Divestment

Maynooth University is the first university in Ireland to take a position on not investing in fossil fuels. In a statement for Trócaire's divestment campaign launch event, it stated: "Maynooth University has no funds invested in fossil fuel industries. It is also the first university in Ireland to publicly commit to fossil-free investment policy in the future, and is committed more generally to proactively developing and being guided by ethical investment principles that are protective of the environment and society."

Recycling of mattresses

Every year, in the Dublin area alone, approximately 100,000 mattresses are disposed of – mostly into landfill. This is the worst possible way to dispose of them. In Maynooth University, every summer many mattresses are disposed of in the end of year cleaning operation, particularly in the student apartments. We are delighted to say that for the past couple of years, Niamh Banks, Residences Supervisor, has arranged for the mattresses to be recycled through a Dublin-based social economy organisation called Eco Mattresses Recycling.
