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## Welcome to the Maynooth University Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) Award

The Extra-Curricular Activities Awards Scheme was established in the 2006 /07 academic year as a result of the initiative of the student leadership in partnership with the University.

This Award aims to recognise and reward those students who give so much back to their fellow students and the wider community through their hard work and commitment to improving the student experience. It operates alongside your degree programme and aims to capture the benefits you have gained from your university life in terms of skills and experiences that you will find valuable in your future life and work.

## Why Should I Apply?

On leaving Maynooth University, graduates will be have to illustrate to potential employers that they not only have a good degree but that they have an array of skills and experiences that will add to and enhance that particular workplace.

So as you enter in to your final year and look forward to graduating, perhaps it is timely to look back on your time here in Maynooth University. What have you achieved while on campus? What have you added to the University experience? What have you discovered about yourself and what you want out of life? The Extra-Curricular Activities Award asks you to pull together your experiences and offers formal recognition for this process in the form of a certificate as well as being included in your University transcript which helps set you apart when applying for jobs.

## What is involved?

In order to be considered for an Extra-Curricular Activities Award, final year students are required to complete the application form in their final semester.

This application form is divided into 3 parts:

#### i) Overview of Activities

This section gives the student an opportunity to outline to the Awards Committee the range and type of activities they were involved in. The Committee is looking for prolonged involvement as well levels of participation and leadership in their chosen activities.

#### ii) Reflective Analysis

This section gives the student an opportunity to outline to the Committee what they have learned, how they learned it and how they have developed as a result of being involved in extra-curricular activities as well the skills that have been mastered including:

- Problem Solving
- Communication (Written & Verbal)
- Leadership
- Teamwork
- Dealing with people
- Organisation
- Time management

*Tip: Reflective Thinking / Reflection is a form of personal response to experiences, situations, events or new information as well as being a "processing" phase where thinking and learning take place.* 

*Reflective Thinking / Reflection is not just conveying information, instruction or argument. It is not pure description, though there may be descriptive elements.* 

#### iii) External Verification

As part of the process we ask all applicants for the Extra-Curricular Activities Award to have 2 credible referees to verify their work and achievement in the area of extra-curricular activities.

Please note that when completing your ECA Awards application form, applicants are asked to be concise whilst at the same time giving enough information to the committee to make decision on your application.

Tip: Why not get a "critical friend" to review your application before submitting to ensure that you are putting in the best possible application and that you are sure the Awards Committee will get a "good" overview of your extra-curricular activity involvement.

### Who can apply?

Please note that only final year undergraduate students can apply for the Extra-Curricular Activities Award.

## The ECA Awards Committee

Applications are then assessed by the Extra-Curricular Activities Awards Committee which is made of the following:

- Vice-President Academic, Registrar & Deputy President
- Academic Dean
- Director of Student Services
- Director of Career Development Centre
- Sports Officer
- Students' Union President (or nominee)
- Student Engagement Officer

## What counts towards The Extra-Curricular Activities Award?

The most important thing to remember when thinking about the activities you will be counting towards your Extra-Curricular Activities Award, is your role in that activity. For example, taking part is not enough; you need to be **actively involved in a consistent manner as well as being actively engaged in a leadership role (s)!** Taking part in a given activity or simply being present is not enough to merit being awarded an ECA Award.

For example, if you wanted to count your time spent with the hurling team, you could not count hours spent playing hurling, you must count the hours where you were developing various skills. Such as leading a team to success, solving a major problem or using your powers of persuasion!

# Maynooth University Graduate Attributes

- Be empowered to recognise and embrace learning as an enjoyable and valuable experience
- Be self-motivated, able to work independently and contribute effectively to team projects
- Be capable of gathering and critiquing information from a variety of sources
- Be intellectually responsible, self-reflective, open-minded, adaptable, curious and creative
- Uphold high ethical and professional standards

Maynooth University students are encouraged to be socially, culturally and environmentally aware and to:

- Recognise their social, environmental and civic responsibilities
- Have integrity, honesty, a sense of justice, and respect for human rights
- Appreciate cultural diversity
