Duration	First Year Orientation: Subject Information Days (9 th & 10 th September - TBC), Welcome Week (15-19 Sept - TBC) plus a number training (Dates TBC). There will be other opportunities during the 2025-26 Academic Year to get involved in the yearlong My Maynooth Programme.
Main Responsibilities & Expectations	 Assist in the facilitation and implementation of the My Maynooth New Student Orientation programme; Welcoming new students to the University at the start and throughout the academic year; Provide information about a variety of topics to new students relating to Maynooth University & SPPU; Deal with queries from new students and referring to other departments where appropriate; Being aware and acquainting new students with campus services and building locations; Facilitating group discussions where appropriate; Lead workshops, presentations and discussions where appropriate; Present a positive image of the University by facilitating campus tours and information sessions to groups of students and other key groups; Required participation in all Orientation Leader Team Training activities; Assist with other Orientation-related projects and activities; Participate in the continual evaluation of all Orientation programmes; Other duties as assigned.
Skills / Qualities	To qualify to be an Orientation Leader, at the time of application and throughout the duration of involvement in the Orientation Programme, Orientation Leaders must: Be currently registered at Maynooth University; Be in good academic standing with the University; Good disciplinary standing; Participate in all mandatory orientation commitments, activities, and associated training A successful applicant shall possess or have the capacity to develop the following characteristics: Flexibility; Strong Interpersonal Skills; Creative, motivated and possessing a strong work ethic; Strong customer service orientation; Ability to work as part of a team as well as to work on your own initiative; Ability to follow through a job from beginning to end; Strong sense of commitment and responsibility; Ability to serve as a role model for new students; Excellent time-keeping and reliability; Want to help people.

Training:

There will be a number of in-person and online training sessions before the end of the academic year and on the lead up to the start of the 2025-26 academic year.

Commitment

The main commitment for our Orientation Leaders will be during the Subject Information Days (9^{th} & 10^{th} September - TBC) and Welcome Week (15^{th} - 19^{th} – TBC) where they typically work from 8.30am until 5 pm.

There will be further opportunities throughout the year for our Orientation Leaders to assist with the yearlong My Maynooth New Student Orientation programme including the Re:Fresh Campaign (Start of Semester 2), the Be September Ready campaign (getting ready for 2nd year), among others.

Orientation Leaders are expected to attend all training sessions.
