Recent Sporting Highlights

The Maynooth University Sports Clubs enjoyed high rates of participation and solid performances through 2015/16. The University was host to many inter-varsity events, starting with the Irish University Athletic Association's Road Relays in November, followed by the Fresher's Basketball Championship in December, multiple archery, fencing, basketball, volleyball, rugby, GAA and soccer matches throughout, and in March welcomed over three hundred male and female rugby players for the Student Sport Ireland League Finals at MU Barnhall RFC. On top of the regular club training sessions and practices both on and off campus, it made for a very busy year.

Just before the start of the academic year, our golfers set the bar very high by winning team silver and Robin Dawson individual gold at the European University Championships in Switzerland.

The remarkable strength and depth of the programme was tested that same weekend as MU also emerged victorious in the final of GUI's most important club competition, the Senior Cup. The Irish team for the World University Championships in France will comprise 5 Maynooth University students including one graduate out of the six-person team.

Kelly-Anne Hutchinson (Equestrian) was also selected for World University Championship honours in Sweden (June 2016). We had a remarkable year at all levels in both the men's and women's soccer; in that we lost every semi-final, with each team that beat them emerging eventual winners!

Our Ladies Gaelic Football Club won their first ever O'Connor Cup. Camogie were finalist in the Purcell Cup. On the men's side, the hurlers were finalists the Kehoe Cup, and in fresher's football it was our seconds that won their championship.

Archery brought a good haul of medals from the Nationals with team golds and individual medals in the various disciplines of barebow, recurve and compound.

Maynooth University was honoured to have Lee Mitchell selected to represent the Irish Universities Rugby Union against England's representative side; a memorable occasion on the grounds of College Park, TCD. Who knows what 2016/17 will bring? Whatever the outcome, we hope that our clubs will continue to be driven from member engagement in the tradition of fun, fitness and friendship.
