Ivan is a Doctoral Research Fellow tied to the “New Deals” project led by Seán O Rian. He earned an undergraduate degree in International Business from DIT and an MSc in European Employment Studies from Trinity College. His Master’s thesis explored life satisfaction outcomes of the employed, through changes in their nation’s unemployment rate using logistic regression; he later presented some of the findings at the 2013 European Social Survey Conference in Dublin.

His proposed PhD project focuses on contingent contracts and highly-skilled temporary workers in Europe.
