Context of ECE in Ireland

- Compulsory Schooling 6-16
- Primary Schools 4-12
- Junior & Senior Infant Classrooms 4-6 year olds
- Early Start –Intervention Programme for 3 year old disadvantaged children in Primary School
- Universal Free Pre-school for all 3-4 year olds (Since January 2010)
- Provision for children under 4 in private, community and voluntary sector
