Second Year Pathways within Arts

You will decide the structure of your degree (based on your subjects and results from first year).

We let you decide if you would prefer to

- specialise in one subject with a little of another Major
 with Minor
- just specialise in one Single Major
- or two subjects **Double Major**



Second Year Pathways within Arts

Single Major – 60 credits of one subject

Subject 1 – 60 credits

Double Major – 30 credits in two subjects

Subject 1 – 30 credits

Subject 2 – 30 credits

Major with minor – 40 credits in one subject; 20 credits in the other

Subject 1 – 40 credits

Subject 2 - 20 credits

Science Subject Choice in Year 2 & beyond

- Science students choose three subjects to progress into Year 2
- After Year 2 you can choose progress in either a Double
 Major (taking two subjects equally to degree level)

• a **Single Major** where you take two subjects in third year and after that, specialise in one subject for your final year



or

Specific subject combinations

- The combination of Chemistry and Mathematical Physics is allowed in second year but <u>not</u> in subsequent years.
- Students choosing Computer Science must also

take Mathematics.

Second year transfer option

Students must complete the following subjects in order to

be eligible to transfer into year 2 of Electronic Engineering:

- Engineering Science,
- Computer Science
- Mathematics

They must achieve at least 50% in each subject on the first

sitting.



Specific Transfer Criteria

Subject	Year 2 Option	Progression Requirement
Business	Progress into Year 2 of MH404 Bachelor of Business Studies	Pass double Business (30 credits) or single Business subject (15 credits) + Economics + Accounting *Pass is 40% or more in each module
Geography	Single major	Average mark of at least 60% in Geography in first year.
History	Single major	Average mark of 50% in History in first year.
Law	LLB Single major; BCL Major [Law, 40 credits & Arts subject, 20 credits]	Students who successfully pass 15 credits of Law in 1st year have following transfer options: -LLB Single major -BCL Major
	 BCL Double Major	Students who successfully pass 30 credits of Law have these additional options:
	BCL Law & Accounting	-BCL Double Major -BCL Law & Business [pass 30 credits of Bus]
	BCL Law & Business	-BCL Law & Acc: [60% or more in Accounting & take AC160]
	BCL Law & Criminology	-BCL Law &Crim: [pass Criminology]

	MH502 Law & Accounting	MH502: 60% in Accounting and 40% in Law.
		*All of the above require AC160
Economics / Finance	MH401 Finance	50% in Economics/Finance & pass in Accounting
	MH401 International Finance & Economics	50% in Economics/Finance & pass in Maths

What is an Elective?

Electives allow you to expand your university education by providing the opportunity to study an area outside your chosen degree programme.

An Elective is 10 credits (a five credit module in semester 1 and a five credit module in semester 2) so it makes up 1/6 of your second year marks.





Why take an Elective?

- Develop new skills that will compliment your chosen programme (e.g. modern languages, entrepreneurship, or science communication)
- 2. Broaden your perspective: study across disciplines, learn how to think differently & appreciate different viewpoints.
- 3. Introduction to the diverse fields of research as well as the excellent lecturing staff throughout the University
- 4. To start a new language or keep up a current one
- 5. Intrigued by the topic



Electives on offer this year

Many students have the opportunity to take an Elective in Year 2

Electives this year include:

- Film & Screen Studies
- Beginners Chinese/German/Spanish
- Continuing French/Spanish/German/Gaeilge/Chinese
- War, Terrorism and Global Security

How an Elective works for - MH201

MH201 Science students cannot progress the science subject studied at 10 credits in second year (subject 3 in the example above) forward into your third and final year.

Other Programmes

An Elective is taken instead of two of your non-core/optional modules (10 credits)



Exception to the Rule... Skills for Success

- Professional Development and Employability Skills module
- **5 credits** in either semester one or semester two
- Practice and develop a range of employability skills: teamwork, communication, leadership, creative problem solving, self awareness and more
- Continuous Assessment: Simulated Recruitment Process with job application, interview and E-portfolio






