TERMS AND CONDITIONS

MAYNOOTH UNIVERSITY TAUGHT MASTERS SCHOLARSHIPS 2019-20

Section 1 - Eligibility

Applicants must intend to pursue a full-time taught master's degree at the university commencing in the academic year 2019-20 and meet the following eligibility criteria:

1. Satisfy the entry requirements of the Maynooth University taught master's programme they intend to undertake in 2019-20 and have applied on www.pac.ie.
2. All applicants must have achieved a minimum 2.1 honours undergraduate degree in order to be considered for a Taught Master's Scholarship.
3. Applicants will be required to upload their undergraduate degree transcripts for their level 8 undergraduate honours degree. Once final degree results are available in June 2019, these must be uploaded to the www.pac.ie course application system to receive confirmation of the scholarship award.
4. Applicants who have been in receipt of a student grant for the final year of their undergraduate studies should submit evidence outlining their grant award as this will be taken into consideration where two candidates are equally ranked on final year undergraduate grades.

Ineligibility

The competition is not open to those who have already commenced a taught master's programme.

Research master's programmes are not eligible for support under the scheme and students interested in research programmes should apply instead for the Maynooth University John and Pat Hume Doctoral Research Awards. Graduates of Maynooth University are allowed to apply for both the Maynooth University Alumni Scholarship and the Taught Master's Scholarship but if successful in both, the candidate will only be allowed to accept one of these scholarships.

Section 2 - Value of the Scholarship

The total value of the scholarship for each student is €2,000.

Section 3 - Allocation of Scholarship

The scholarship may be awarded for taught master's study in any of the Maynooth University academic departments or research institutes, and a specific number of awards are available in each of these. Where there are insufficient eligible applicants within a particular department, the Graduate Studies Office will reallocate the scholarships among remaining applicants within the Faculty. These remaining applicants will be ranked by highest undergraduate final grades.

Section 4 - Assessment

The Taught Master's Scholarships will be awarded to the most highly qualified applicants, separately ranked in each department or institute, based upon the highest overall results in final year examinations. Students must demonstrate that they have achieved an overall minimum 2.1 final result in their undergraduate honours degree. The results of examinations taken after 1st July 2019 will not be considered. The Graduate Studies Office will check the eligibility of candidates and rank them for each department or institute according to the academic achievement of the student.

Section 5 - Application Process

Section 6 - Submitting an application

All applications must be submitted prior to the closing date. All required fields must be completed. Please ensure that you have uploaded your final degree transcript via the online application system. If you do not yet have a final transcript as you are graduating in 2019, please upload your results from 2018. To access transcripts please contact the student records office of your university or awarding body to request a copy of your results.

After the closing date of the 30th June 2019, all applicants will be considered for a scholarship based on the academic transcripts provided. The highest ranked candidates in the scholarship application process will be contacted in July 2019 with an offer of a €2,000 scholarship.

Section 7 - Payment of Scholarships

Offers of scholarships will be announced in June and July 2019. In the academic year 2019-20 the scholarships will be paid to registered awardees in two payments of €1,000. Failure to cover payment of course fees by the 31st January 2020 will result in suspension of the 2nd payment until full fees have been paid.

Section 8 - Miscellaneous

Where an applicant does not achieve the results required for admission to the programme, the applicant will not be eligible to receive a scholarship. If an awardee does not take up a place or accept the scholarship, the award may be made to the next

ranked candidate in that department or institute, at the discretion of the Head of Department and Dean of Graduate Studies.

If a student is applying for a two-year master's programme, the €2,000 scholarship is only available in the first year of the programme.

Awardees that subsequently cease study will be ineligible to apply again.

The Taught Master's Scholarship may not be deferred.

Taught Master's Scholarship awardees for 2019-20 who subsequently continue into PhD or other research programmes at Maynooth University will not be excluded from applying for the John and Pat Hume Doctoral Research Awards.

Section 9 - Closing Date

Completed applications should be submitted via the online application system no later than **5pm on the 30th June 2019**.

Late applications will not be accepted under any circumstances.
