


Best practices for assisting record numbers of threatened scholars



As SAR members, you are on the front-lines of assisting the record numbers of scholars who are reaching out for assistance. This past year, SAR members proved their commitment to responding to the crisis of attacks on higher education communities by offering to host more threatened scholars than ever before. Thank you!

Facing an unprecedented demand for SAR's services (compared with this time last year, we're receiving, on average, double the monthly applications), SAR is working diligently to prioritize the case assessments of scholars in the most urgent situations and those for whom host institutions have been identified.

We recommend the following steps to help us in our goal of assisting as many scholars as possible at this time:

 If you are contacted by a scholar seeking assistance, please direct these scholars to apply to SAR at <u>www.scholarsatrisk.org/secure-submission</u> or <u>apply.scholarsatrisk@nyu.edu</u>. He is seeking research and/or teaching opportunities in Europe beginning immediately.

DRCO-570 (Political Science; Sociology): This scholar has more than a decade of experience teaching at a university in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Specializing in conflict resolution and human rights, this scholar also has significant research experience in universities and NGOs and has authored several articles on peace and conflict in Africa. He faces threats to his life due to the content of his academic work. He is seeking research and/or teaching opportunities in French-speaking Africa, Europe, or North America beginning immediately.

ETHI-589 (Geography): This scholar specializes in urban geography and development studies and has over a decade of teaching experience at universities in Ethiopia, Norway, and the US. He has practical experience working on local research projects using GIS technology and has published many articles on urban geography in Ethiopia. He faced threats to his life in Ethiopia due to the content of his academic work. This scholar is seeking research and/or teaching opportunities in the US beginning immediately.

UKRA-513 (Chemistry): This junior scholar specializes in analytical chemistry, chemical kinetics, thermodynamics, and catalysis, and has some experience teaching at the university level in Ukraine. He has published several articles in international journals and has two years of experience conducting field research in Spain and Ukraine. He faces risk due to the ongoing situation in Ukraine. This scholar is seeking research opportunities in a safe location beginning immediately.
