Note A – Minor and dependent adult children who are in full time post primary education or the spouse / civil partner of Irish State Officials and comparable EU / EEA /Swiss officials who reside with that state official while posted outside the EU / EEA / Switzerland on diplomatic or consular missions shall have such time deemed as being time spent residing in the EU / EEA / Switzerland when determining whether or not the residency requirements of the Free Fees Inititaive have been met.

Note B – At the time of offering a student a place at Maynooth University the prospective student may be requested to fill in an EU Tuition Fee Determination Form and to provide certain documents in order to verify that the student's Fee Status has been correctly determined. The documentary evidence to be provided could include the following:

- A copy of the student's passport and GNIB card where applicable.
- A letter from the Minister of Justice and Law Reform confirming the student's status [in the case of students with refugee status, a family member of a refugee, humanitarian leave to remain in the state, permission to remain in the state following a decision not to deport, subsidiary protection with permission to reside in the state].
- A copy of a GNIB card with a Stamp 4 EUFam stamp [in the case of family members of EU citizens]
- Copies of parents' P21s for 3 of the last 5 years.
- A letter from the student's school confirming periods of attendance.
