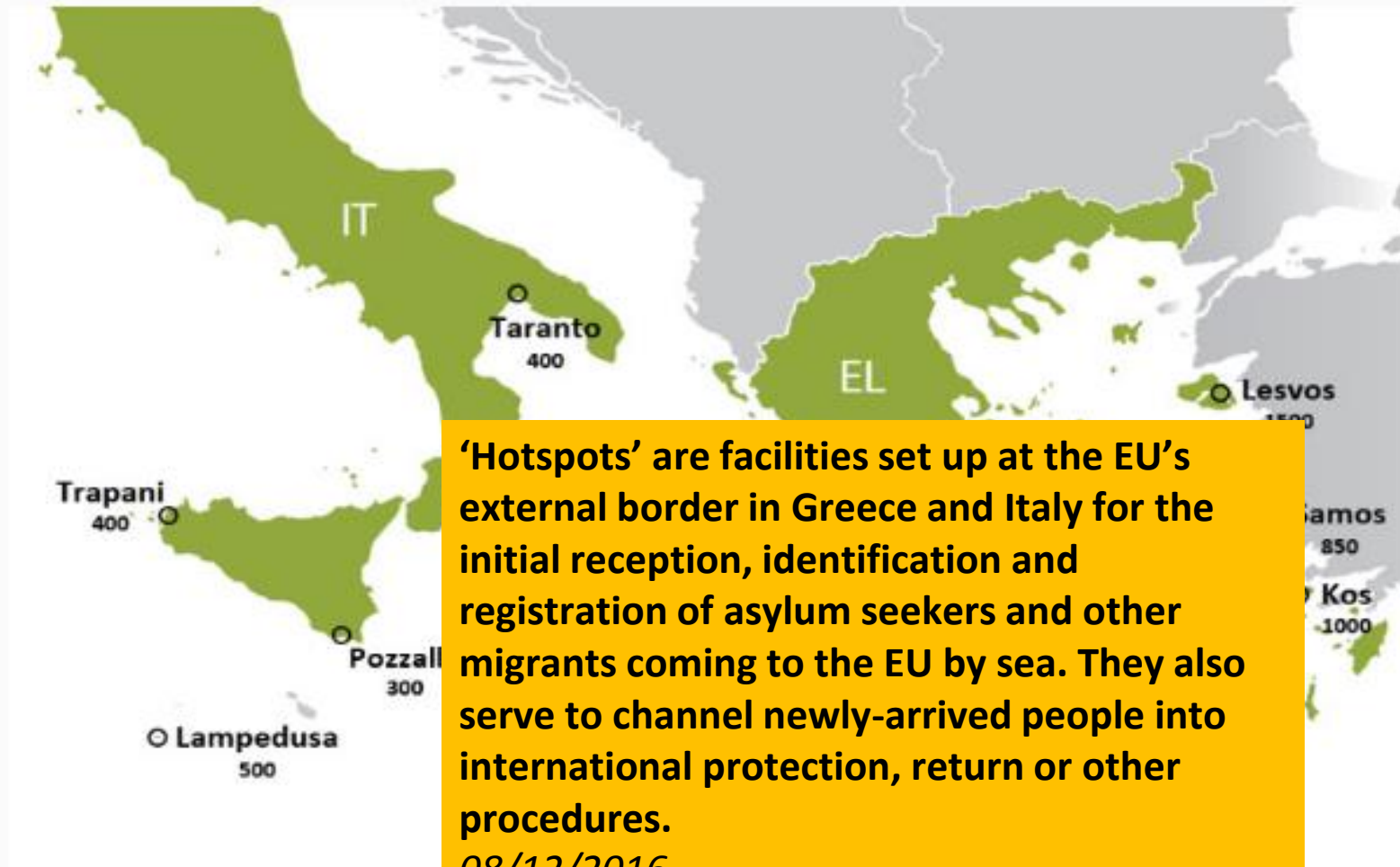

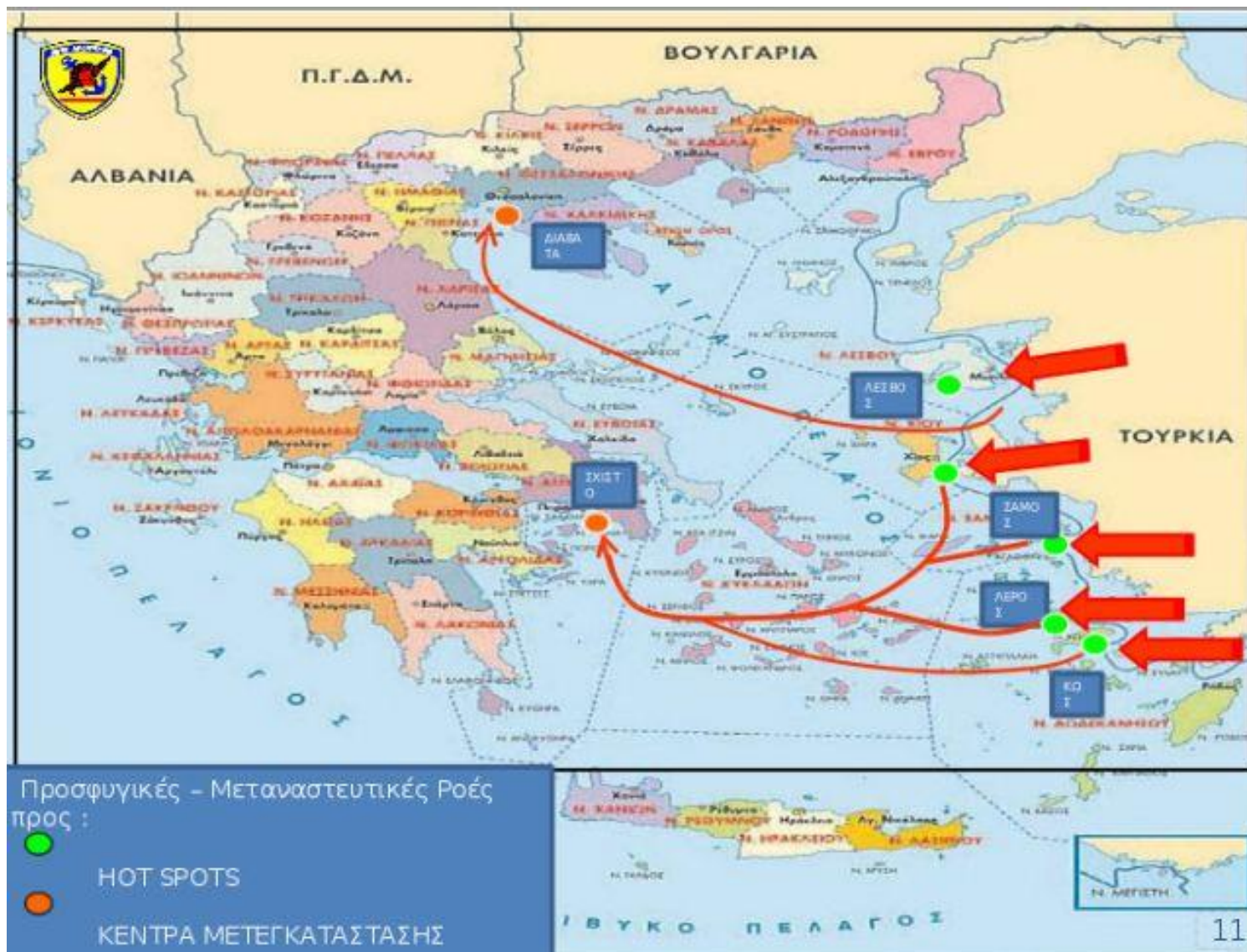

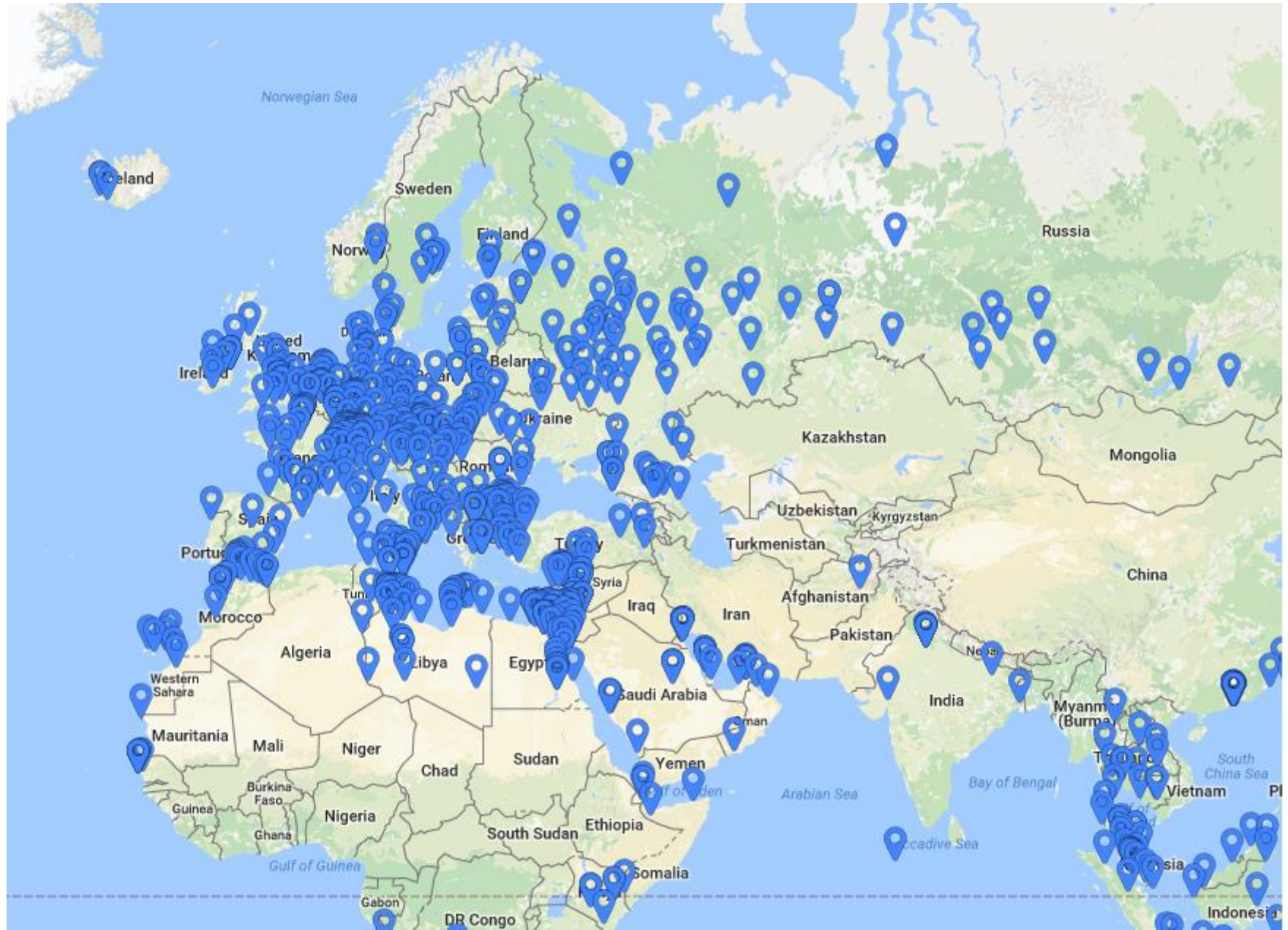

A Syrian family-of-10 arrived in Ireland Friday night as part of the first group of refugees to be relocated here since the crisis swept across Europe.



“These people have fled war and destruction. Having spent two years in refugee camps in Turkey, the family are absolutely exhausted. They’ve displayed huge resilience,” said a source familiar with their arrival. The EU relocation scheme has stalled after the low take up, with many migrants arriving making their own way to host countries, rather than registering in entry states in the Mediterranean.

The parents and their five girls and three boys fled IS-controlled areas of the war-torn country and landed at Dublin Airport last night, after flying from Athens, Greece. Health support, schooling and linguistic help will all be arranged for the young family, particularly to aid the children who are all aged under 11.





In 2016, the Republic of Ireland showed a net positive immigration rate for the first time since 2009.

By the end of 2015, the number of non-EU residents living in Ireland rose to 114,000, up from 105,000 at the end of 2014. The number of people ordered to leave the country has also steadily increased: 3,790 people were issued return orders in 2015 compared with 1,285 in 2008.³

The International Protection Act 2015 reformed asylum law in Ireland. The Act “streamlines procedures, creating a single application process for all applicants of international protection aimed at speeding up waiting times and reducing time spent in the Direct Provision system of reception.” The Act also allows for harsher detention measures and restricts family reunification provisions by excluding extended family members and those who get married after the submission of their asylum application.

From the 2015 Act

- enhanced measures to improve the efficiency of the asylum system including, designation of safe countries of origin, prioritisation of applications, acceleration of certain appeals, and the engagement under contracts of services of persons to assist in the processing of applications.
- specific guarantees for applicants who are unaccompanied minors including the appointment of a person by the Child and Family Agency to represent and assist the child throughout the application process.

Direct Provision

What are Asylum Seekers provided with under Direct Provision?

Accommodation on a full-board basis. The cost of all meals, heat, light, laundry, tv, household maintenance, etc. are paid directly by the State.

Personal allowances of €19.10 per adult and €9.60 euro per child per week.

What is Direct Provision?

Direct provision is a means of meeting the basic needs of food and shelter for asylum seekers directly while their claims for refugee status are being processed rather than through full cash payments. Direct provision commenced on 10 April, 2000 from which time asylum seekers have received full board accommodation and personal allowances of €19.10 per adult and €9.60 per child per week.

The contract is on-going but it is up for renewal in October and it remains to be seen if it will be renewed as residents continue to protest since April against standards slipping in the hotel.

In a statement to the **Leinster Leader** the RIA said that the current accomodation system still "provides the best value for money".

"There is no basis in holding that, because the private sector manages Direct Provision centres under contract to RIA it is any less capable of treating residents respectfully," it reads. "RIA carefully monitors contracts to ensure that all residents are treated with dignity."

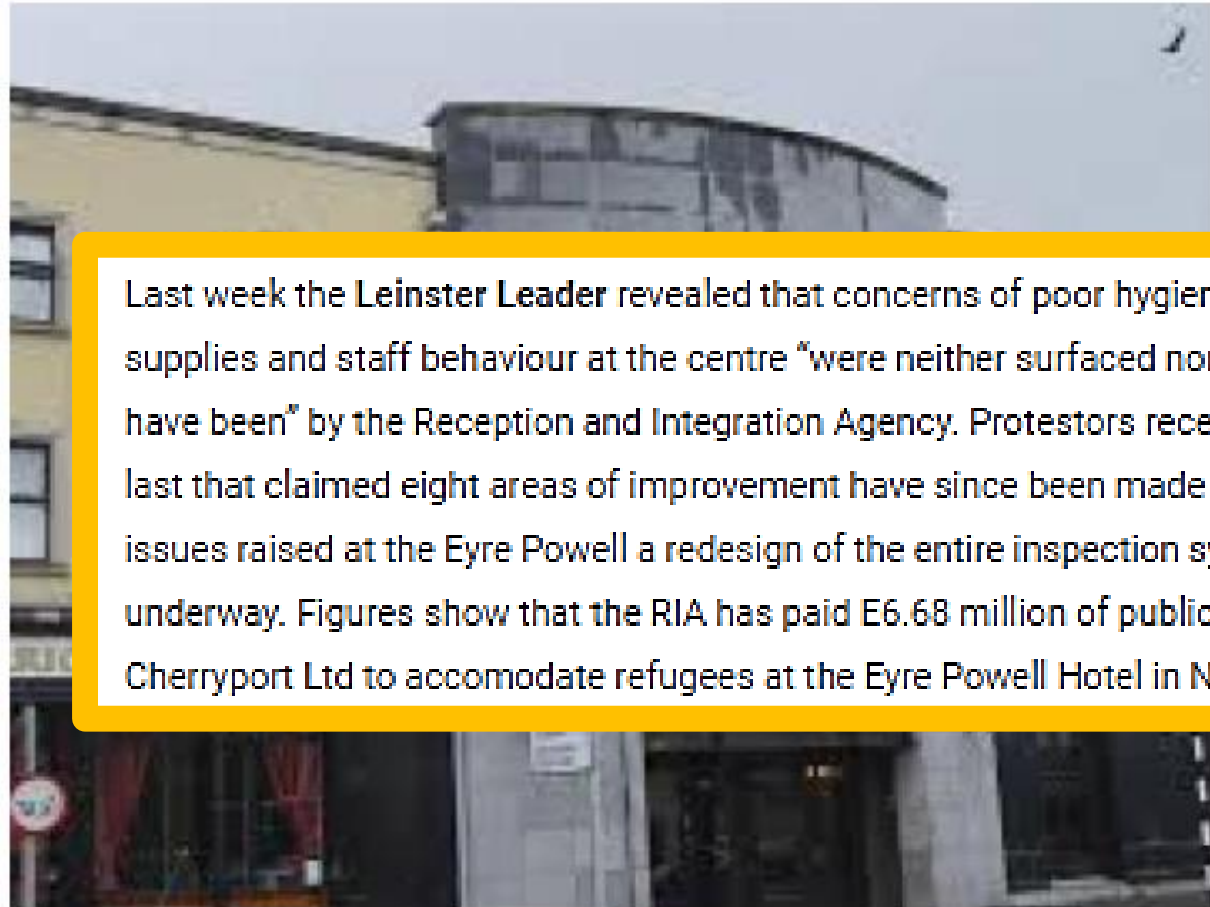

Last week the **Leinster Leader** revealed that concerns of poor hygiene, lack of basic provisions, poor food supplies and staff behaviour at the centre “were neither surfaced nor addressed as quickly as they might have been” by the Reception and Integration Agency. Protestors received a response from the RIA on July 5 last that claimed eight areas of improvement have since been made to the centre and as a result of the issues raised at the Eyre Powell a redesign of the entire inspection system for refugee centres is now underway. Figures show that the RIA has paid E6.68 million of public monies to private contractor Cherryport Ltd to accomodate refugees at the Eyre Powell Hotel in Newbridge from 2003 to 2010.
