STRUCTURED PHD PROGRAMME (LEVEL 10)

DURATION: 4 YEARS (FULL TIME), 6 YEARS (P/T)

The Structured PhD is part of a University-wide programme, which provides modules that students can undertake in the course of their studies, including modules developing graduate competences, transferable skills and research capacities. This programme is designed to support students to conduct research at the highest level in a reflexive and critical way. The Structured PhD takes four years full-time or six years part-time to complete.

CLOSING DATE: research applications are accepted at any time.

Interviews with candidates are typically held in the spring so it is recommended that you contact the coordinators well in advance of this during the autumn/winter term with your initial proposal.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Primary degree (or equivalent) and a Master's degree in Adult and Community Education or a relevant discipline,
- Experience in higher or adult education,
- Proven ability in academic writing.

COURSE STRUCTURE

This is a 4 year full time or 6 years part time programme. Students complete 30 credits of modules over the course of the programme, including compulsory and elective modules. Students complete an individual planning review at the outset and annual reviews which include selection of relevant modules. Students attend monthly half day group supervision sessions as well as individual supervision and the broader support of the department's research centre.
